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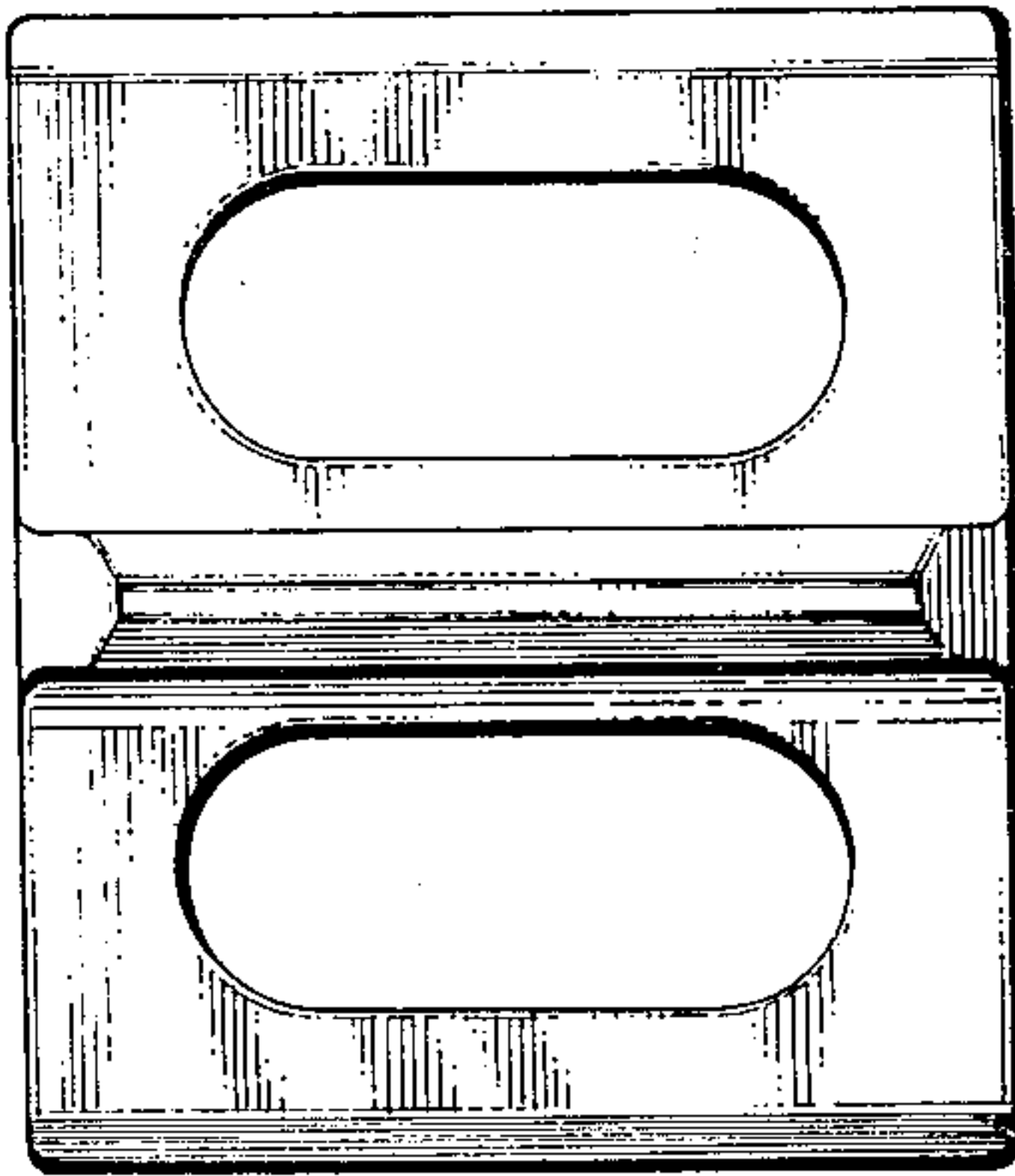
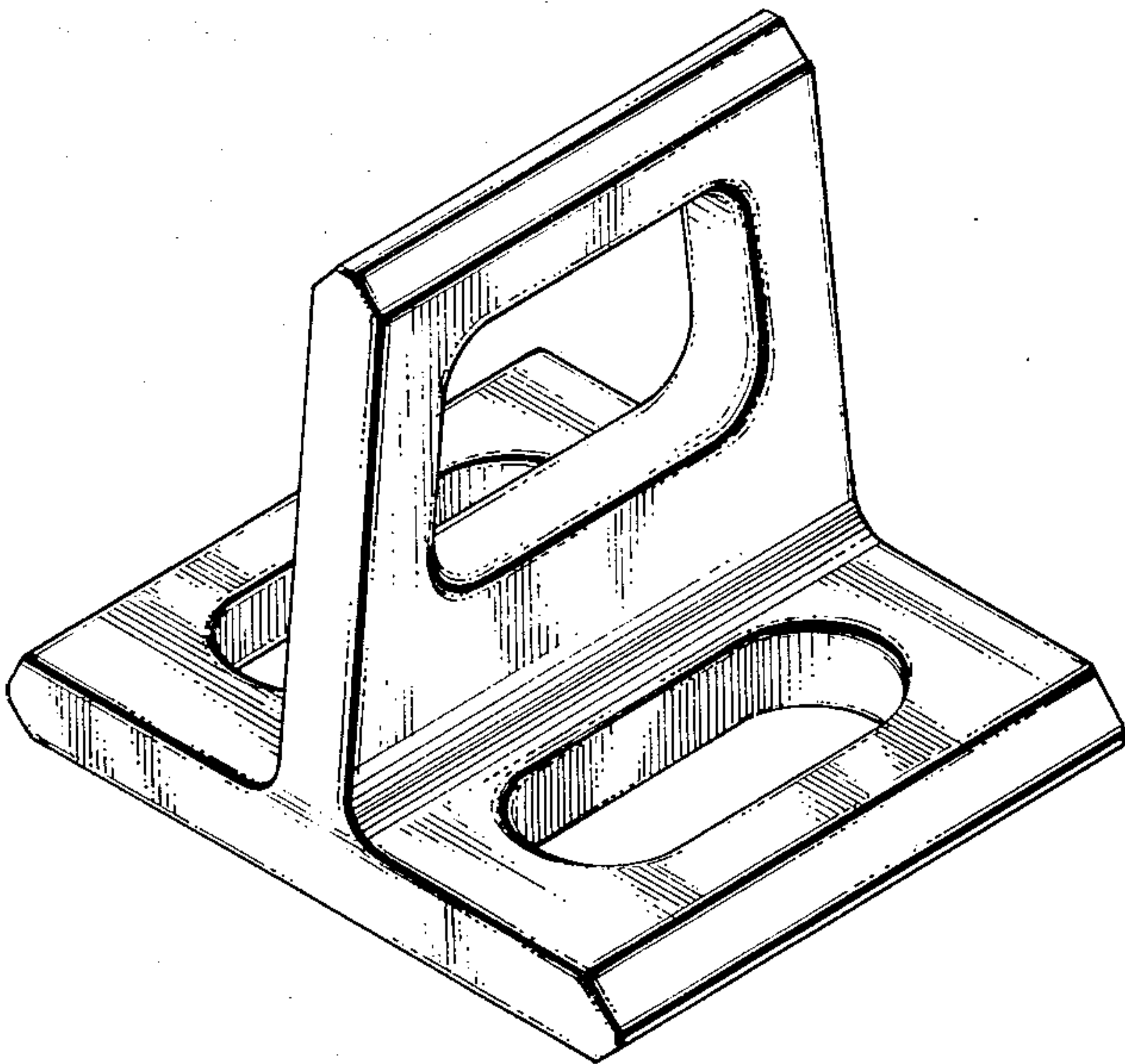

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a T-fitting for a mountain climber's sling showing my new design;
FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof;
FIG. 3 is a front elevation thereof;
FIG. 4 is a bottom plan view thereof; and,
FIG. 5 is a left end elevational view thereof.
The rear elevation is identical to the front elevation and the right end elevational view is identical to the left end elevational view.



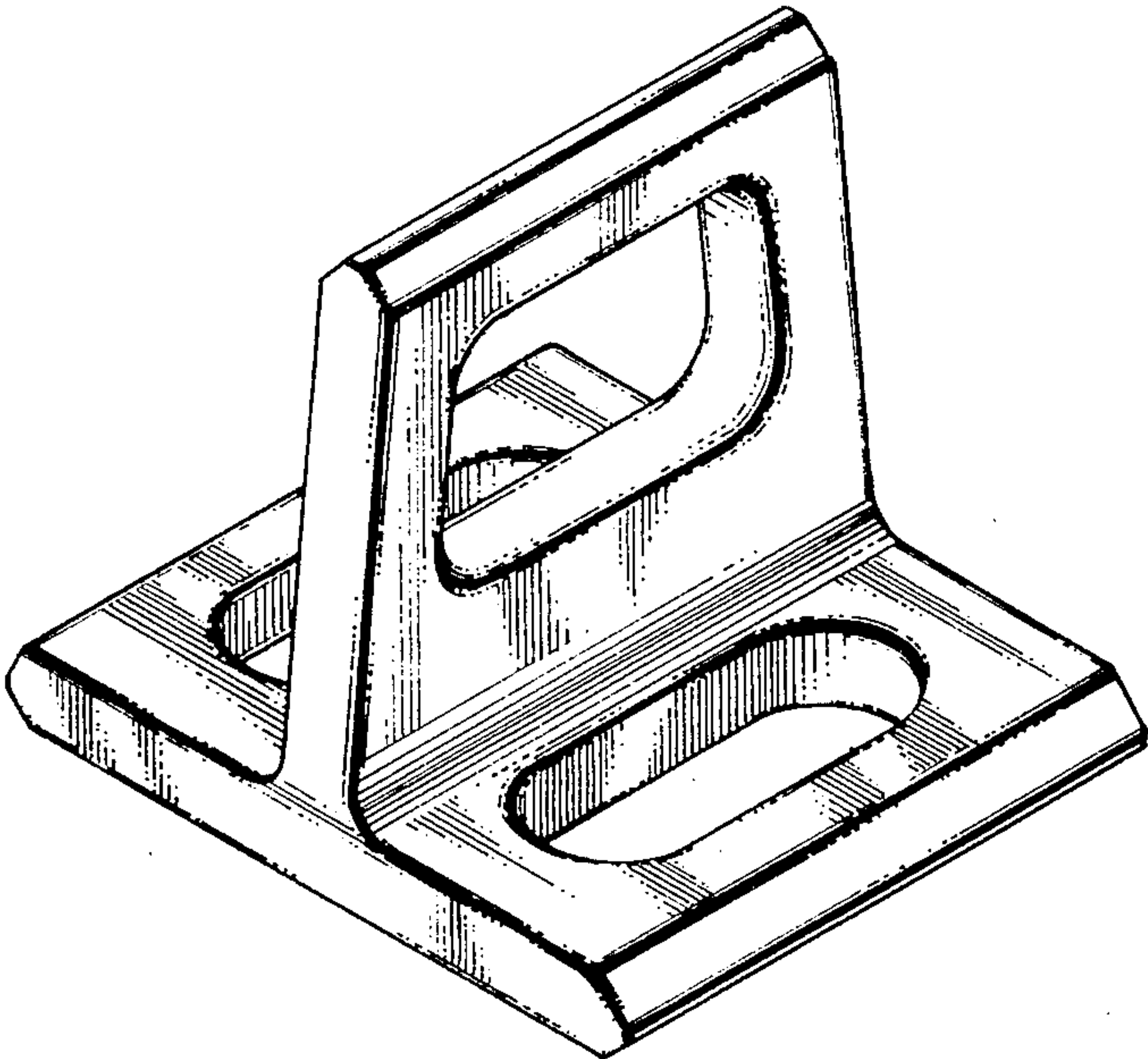

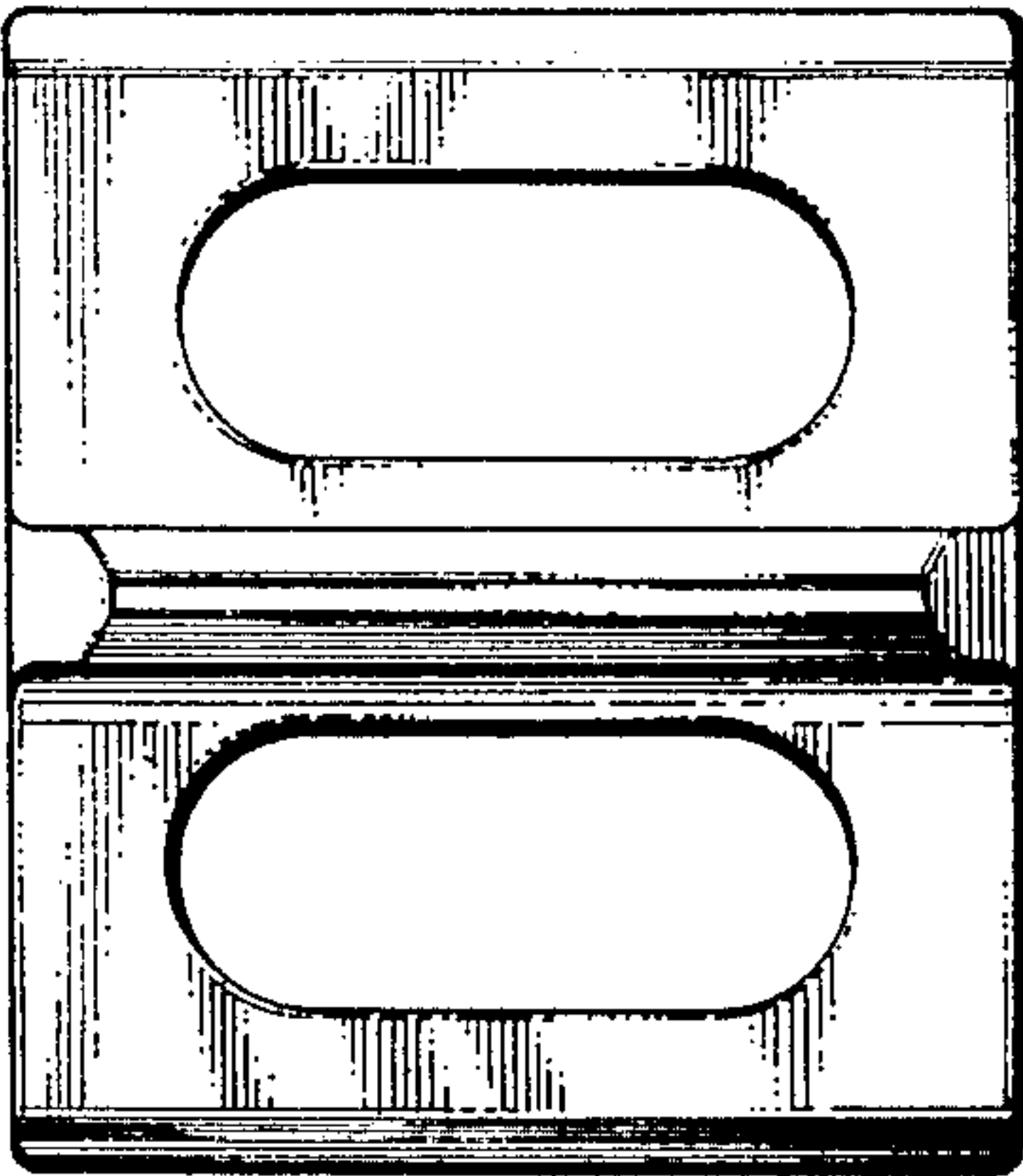

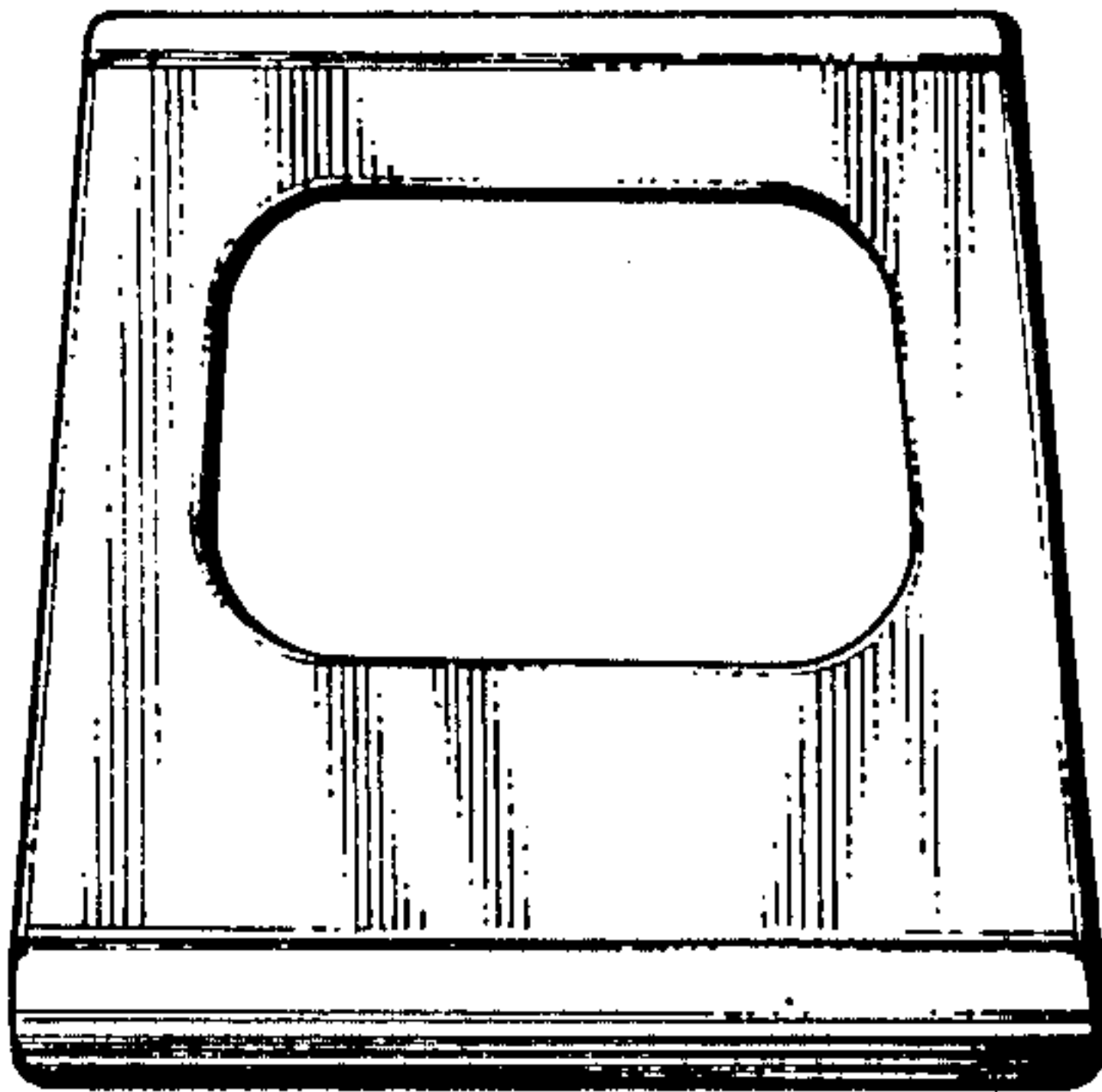

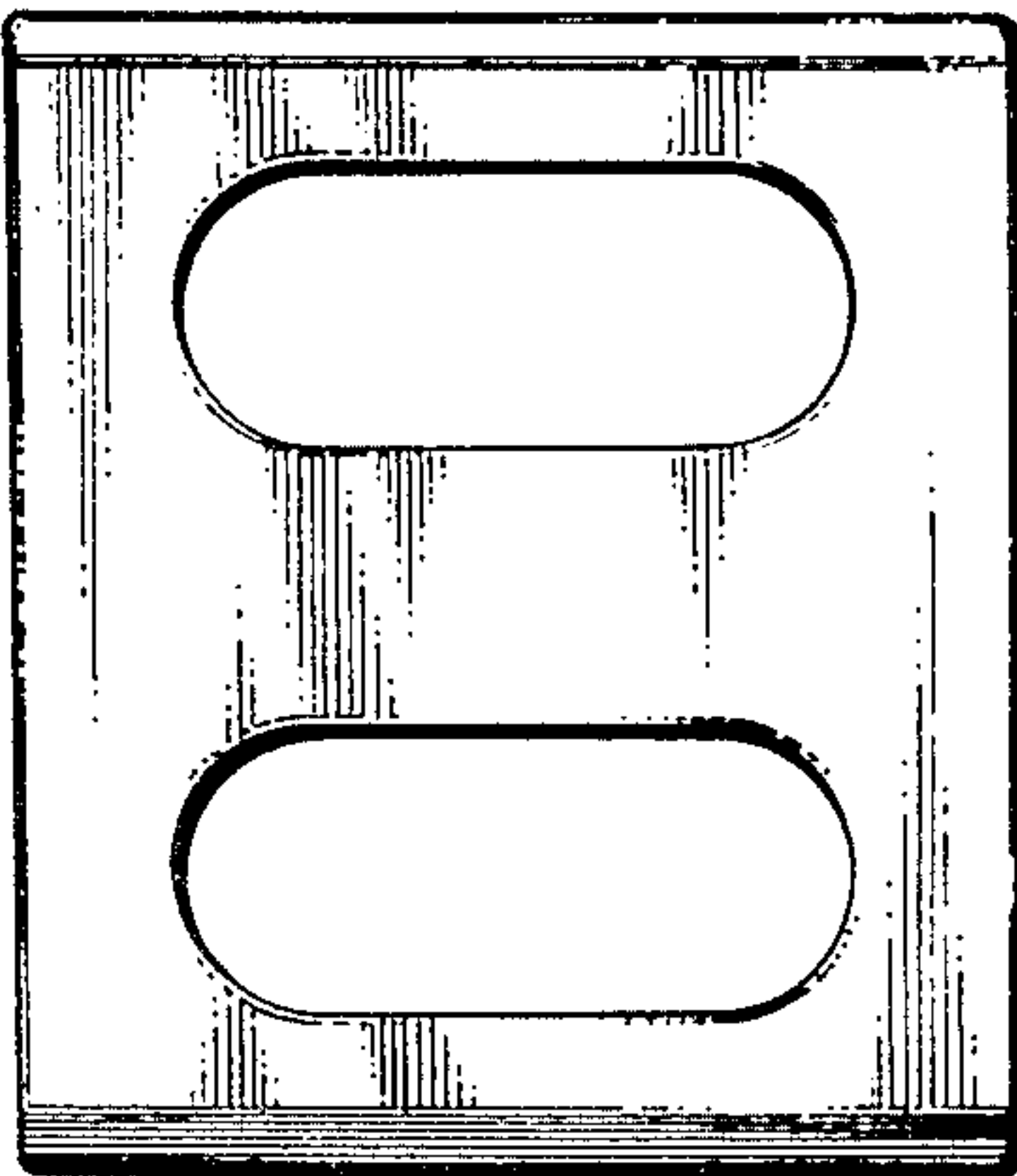

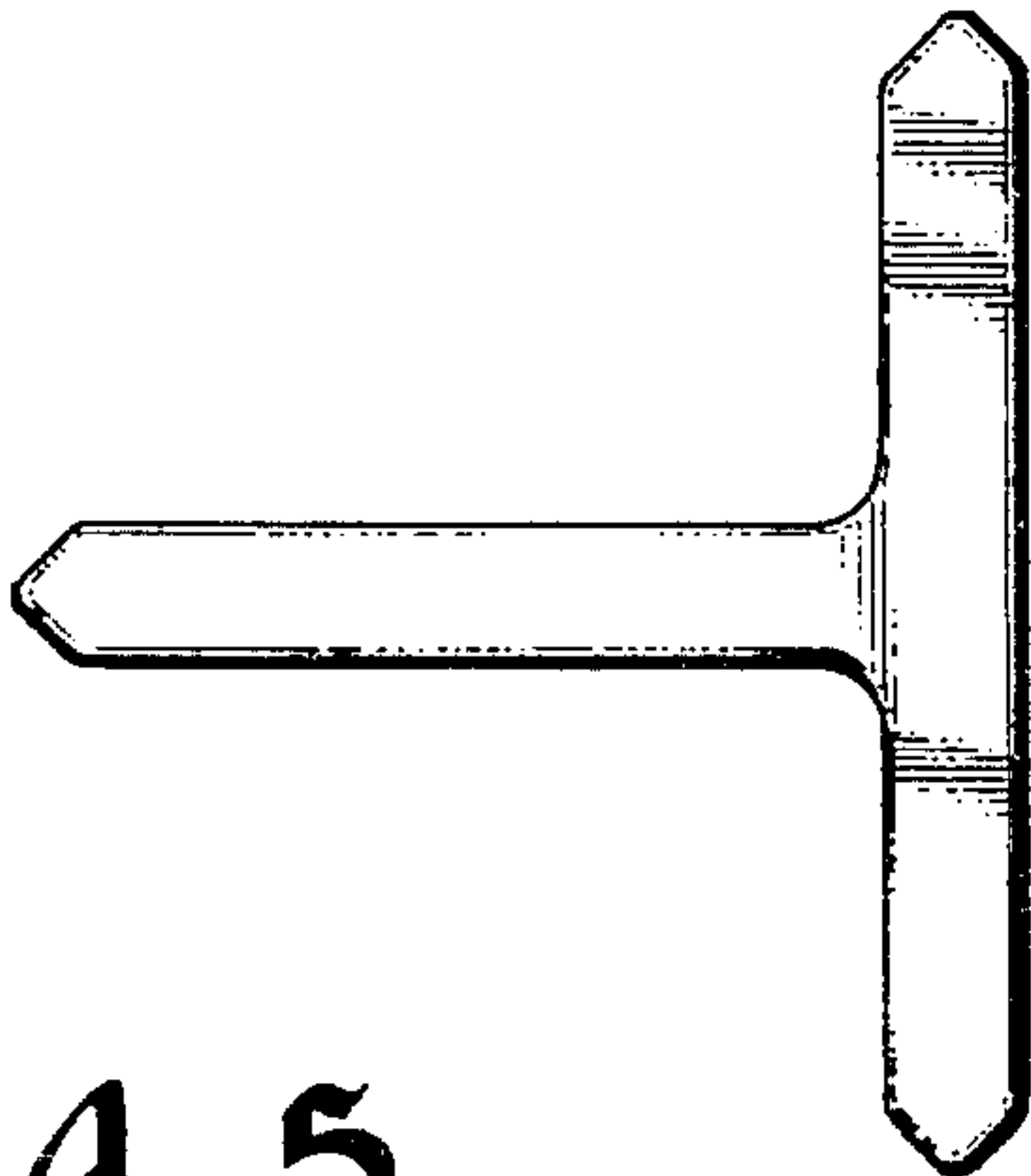
